7 a. Chairperson's Report

Discussion Chairperson Foley:

 Reported he and Director Case attended the District Boards Association Winter Meeting in La Crosse.

- Announced the Board Retreat February 10, 2020 from 8:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and stated the focus of the retreat being Strategic Planning and the Guided Pathways Update.
- Asked Ms. Case to give the Foundation Report.
- Ms. Case:
  - Reported on the discussion between the MATC Foundation and its Board of Directors, such as MATC's Re-Entry Programs with a focus on a program done through a Workforce Solutions partnership with UMOS; the Uniquely Abled Project, a program training those with high-functioning autism to be CNC machinists; JobUp Milwaukee, a new program that the Foundation secured more than \$600,000 in seed funding for.

- Stated Dr. Martin mentioned in her President's Report that MATC is exploring opportunities to meet students' housing needs for both single and family housing.
- Discussed the time used to discuss the MATC Promise program. This included a report on results to date by Sara Willkomm, Academic Affairs Analyst. To launch the Promise Program, the Foundation worked with the college to secure \$2 million in contributions to support "last dollar" scholarships to help bridge the gap between a student's financial aid award and the cost of tuition.
- Announced MATC recently celebrated to opening of the new Al Hurvis/PEAK Transportation Center, which is the result of a public-private partnership.

# 7 b. President's Report

### Discussion

Dr. Martin:

- Introduced Dr. Jeff Janz as MATC's new VP Retention & Completion, leading departments including Retention & Scheduling, Judicial Affairs, Advising and Student Experience.
- Announced Dr. Amir Law will serve as VP Enrollment Management, leading departs including Financial Aid, Career and Academic Assessment and Enrollment Services/Registration.
- Announced the Student Services Resource Center Grand Opening to take place Thursday, January 30. Among the Community Partners thanked were: WCS, Center for Driver License Recovery, Milwaukee Employment Training, Mental Health America, Legal Action of Wisconsin, Sojourner Family Peace Center, Hunger Task Force, UMW Education Opportunity Center, City of Milwaukee Health Department, City of Milwaukee Fatherhood Initiative, Right Path Programs, and Dreamkeepers Emergency Financial Assistance Program. Dr. Martin thanked Walter Lanier and Janice Falkenberg for all their work in putting this together.
- Reported MATC's basketball team is ranked second in National Junior College Division II
- Stated DNC announced the security perimeter. MATC falls into the west end outer perimeter that goes up to 10<sup>th</sup> street. Also stated the college will be closed for classes on July 13 – 16.
- Announced the college was accepted for Achieving The Dream.

# 7 d. Milwaukee PBS General Manager's Report

#### Discussion

Mr. Bohdan Zachary was not present; the following are highlights of his written report:

- Milwaukee PBS and the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel won an award for the "Kids In Crisis: You're Not Alone" documentary and the station was applauded for its wins for Local Content at Sunday night's opening awards ceremony.
- Milwaukee PBS and MATC met for a second time with the PBS NewsHour convention production planners, if things go according to plans, the PBS NewsHour staff of 50 will work out of the Milwaukee PBS station in the weeks leading up to the July 13 start of the DNC Convention.
- Milwaukee PBS continue to plan for the October live broadcast of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra in its new concert hall on Wisconsin Avenue. PBS expressed an interest in airing Milwaukee PBS' complete special nationally in 2021.

# 7 e. Legislative Matters Report

## Discussion

Ms. Ramie Zelenkova, lobbyist, Hubbard Wilson & Zelenkova, gave an update (via telephone) on recent legislative matters impacting higher education such as:

- Senate Bill 612/Assembly Bill 670 increases the minimum retirement age under the WRS from 55 to 59.5 and first applies to individuals under age 40 on the bill's effective date. The bill would also allow an annuitant who is hired by a WRS employer to elect not to suspend his or her annuity, for no more than 36 months, and reduces the waiting period to 45 days for recent retirees who return to covered employment as a participating employee.
- Senate Bill 518/Assembly Bill 576 (Kooyenga/VanderMeer)
  relating to requirements for funeral director apprenticeships and
  licenses. Amended and passed Assembly Committee 9-0; Senate
  Committee 5-0.
