ITEM 6. Reports

6 a. Chairperson's Report

Discussion Chairperson Foley:

- Congratulated the more than 800 MATC Winter Graduates.
- Announced the Winter Commencement will air on Saturday, December 19 on Channel 10 at 4:30 p.m. and Sunday, December 20 on Channel 36 at 4:00 p.m.
- Drew attention to the Board Self-Evaluation Instrument. Stated he was looking for feedback from the board and asked if the instrument serves to evaluate the board performance or are there any revisions the board would like to see. A revised version of the instrument will be distributed before the January 2021 Board Meeting.
- Asked the Board for topics on a late first quarter or second quarter Board Retreat. Would like suggestions on what the Board should discuss or focus on post-pandemic. Ann Wilson stated she would like to discuss what impact the November Elections will have on higher education.
- Introduced Laura Bray, VP College Advancement and External Communications, who gave the following MATC Foundation Report on behalf of liaison board member David Mitchell. Ms. Bray shared the following points:
 - The Foundation Board discussed and approved to revise spending and investment policies in response to current market conditions and a lower interest environment.
 - Director of Operations, Christine McGee, will be retiring in March.
 - Due to a generous donor, the Foundation was able to hire two part-time Communication Specialists.
 - The Foundation discussed Board Engagement. To provide the Foundation Board with a deeper understanding of MATC programs and initiatives, the Board has begun to attend virtual learning sessions with different stakeholders within the college. The Board will learn about the MATC Promise program in December and the AI Hurvis/PEAK Transportation Center in early 2021.

 The Foundation staff coordinates the employee giving campaign at MATC and this year, through the generosity of faculty, staff, administrators and retirees, the college has exceeded its goal.

6 b. President's Report

Discussion Dr. Martin:

- Introduced Dr. Naydeen Gonzalez-De Jesus as MATC's Executive Vice President of Student Success. Dr. Gonzalez-De Jesus will oversee academic student services and the college's regional campuses.
 - Dr. Gonzalez-De Jesus briefly introduced herself and stated that prior to coming to MATC she served as a public diplomacy officer at the United States Embassy in Buenos Aires, Argentina. She has held the position of Vice President of Student Affairs at a two-year college in Northern New Jersey, where she led the implementation of Achieving The Dream.
- Stated the college continues to offer programming around diversity, equity and inclusion and she had the honor of hosting a college-wide discussion on the book <u>How to Be an Anti-Racist</u> by Ibram X. Kendi.
- Expressed her heartfelt appreciation on behalf of the entire college for the support the Board has shown to the faculty, staff and administration as they faced daunting challenges this year in continuing to ensure the college fulfilled its' mission to educate and transform lives.

6 c. District Student Senate Report

Discussion Ms. Brandi Martin:

- Announced the District Student Government voted to support the Men of Color Initiative by matching funds. With additional funding, the hope is to expand services and offer more support to assist the students.
- Stated Student Life is offering engaging events as the fall semester comes to an end. One such event is The Nutcracker presented by New Paltz Ballet Theater online on December 24, 2020.

6 d. Milwaukee PBS VP General Manager's Report

Discussion Mr. Bohdan Zachary:

- Stated Milwaukee PBS plans to continue to air the existing nine seasons of Around the Corner with John McGivern during the 2021 season in its' Thursday night slot.
- Announced that in response to the challenging financial circumstances brought about by COVID-19, Milwaukee PBS is exploring different production models for three of its programs, including Around the Corner with John McGivern.
- Reported COVID-19 has resulted in more viewers tuning in to Milwaukee PBS. Despite a faltering economy stemming out of the pandemic, the station held steady to meet or exceed its FY21 goal of \$5.1 million.
- Stated General Individual giving among members and major donors is 8% ahead of 2019 figures to date.
- Reported Milwaukee PBS has raised \$430,000 from 2,700 members through on-air fundraising campaigns. \$262,000 of that is from the December Pledge Drive.
- Announced this year's #Giving Tuesday goal was \$25,000 and \$50,000 was raised from 527 donors, a 163% increase in revenue and 183% increase in donors vs. last year
- Reported Milwaukee PBS has received nearly \$250,000 in estate gifts for FY21 so far. Thirteen estates are in probate and Milwaukee PBS has 120 members of the Legacy Society who have included the station in their estate plans.
- Shared Milwaukee PBS is a finalist for Excellence in Content for the 52nd Annual Public Media Awards that will be given out in January.

6 e. Legislative Matters Report

Discussion Ms. Janice Falkenberg, VP General Counsel introduced Ms. Ramie Zelenkova, lobbyist, Hubbard Wilson & Zelenkova, who presented the Legislative Matters Report on recent legislative matters impacting higher education, such as:

- A compromise on the COVID-19 relief package has not been reached yet and may not until January when legislative leadership reconvene for the upcoming session.
- Legislative leadership have been elected and nominated by their peers heading into the next session and the committee structure has been developed.

ITEM 7. BOARD MONITORING

7 a. Enrollment Report

Information Dr. Naydeen Gonzalez-De Jesus, EVP Student Success, discussed the Enrollment Report with a brief slide presentation and oral report highlighting the college's FY2021 FTE goal, comparison to FY2020 FTEs, FTE YTD progress or "pacing" to goal and strategies for enrollment.

7 b. Pathway Presentation/Dual Enrollment

Information Mr. Jonathan Feld, Director High School Relations and University Transfer, discussed the Pathway Presentation/Dual Enrollment via PowerPoint and highlighted Dual Enrollment opportunities offered to MATC students as well as the demographics of those students who took the courses. The report featured success stories of some of the students and the fact there are more and more students taking these courses every year.

7 c. Taxable General Obligation Bond Refunding Plan

Information Mr. Jeffrey Hollow, VP Finance, deferred to Mr. Mehan, who presented the Taxable General Obligation Bond Refunding Plan as information by stating New Bonds are issued the proceeds from which are invested in Open Market Securities that at maturity will generate sufficient revenue to pay off the existing bonds on their call date. The advance refunding is conducted when it can be determined that the new bonds debt service payments, after cost of issuance, are sufficiently lower than the existing bonds debt service payments.

This item was presented earlier in the meeting.







RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF \$1,500,000.00 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES, SERIES 2020-21H (F0165-01-21)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 67.12(12) of the Wisconsin Statutes, as amended (the "Act"), the Milwaukee Area Technical College District, Wisconsin (the "District"), is authorized to issue notes of the District in the aggregate amount of \$1,500,000.00 for the public purpose of financing building remodeling and improvement projects, consisting of projects included in the District's 2020-2021 building remodeling and improvement program (the public purpose projects described above are hereafter referred to as the "Public Purposes"); and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2020, the District authorized the issuance of \$1,500,000.00 General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2020-21H (the "Notes") for the Public Purposes; and

WHEREAS, the District has prepared and distributed a Preliminary Official Statement, dated January 19, 2021 (the "Preliminary Official Statement"), describing the Notes and the security therefor; and

WHEREAS, the District has examined proposed documentation for the Notes (collectively, the "Note Documents"), as follows:

(a) an Official Notice of Sale issued by the District and a Parity Bid Form (the "Note Purchase Agreement") to be entered into between the District and the Underwriter, providing for the sale of the Notes; and

(b) the Preliminary Official Statement.

WHEREAS, it is now expedient and necessary for the District to issue its general obligation promissory notes in the amount of \$1,500,000.00 for the Public Purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, the District hereby resolves as follows:

Section 1. <u>Definitions</u>. The following terms shall have the following meanings in this Resolution unless the text expressly or by implication requires otherwise:

"Act" shall mean Section 67.12(12) of the Wisconsin Statutes;

"Code" shall mean the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

"<u>Continuing Disclosure Agreement</u>" shall mean the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, executed and delivered by the Issuer, dated February 10, 2021 (the "Continuing Disclosure Agreement"), delivered by the District for the purpose of complying with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended;

"Dated Date" shall mean February 10, 2021;

"<u>Debt Service Fund</u>" shall mean the Debt Service Fund of the District, which shall be the "special redemption fund" as such term is defined in the Act;

"District" shall mean the Milwaukee Area Technical College District, Wisconsin;

"<u>Fiscal Agent</u>" shall mean the Treasurer of the District or such other entity as the District may approved to act as fiscal agent;

"<u>Governing Body</u>" shall mean the Board of the District, or such other body as may hereafter be the chief legislative body of the District;

"Initial Resolution" shall mean the "Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of \$1,500,000.00 General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2020-21H of Milwaukee Area Technical College District, Wisconsin", adopted by the Governing Body on December 15, 2020;

"Note Registrar" means the Secretary of the District;

"<u>Notes</u>" shall mean the \$1,500,000.00 General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2020-21H, of the District;

"<u>Public Purposes</u>" shall mean the public purpose of financing \$1,500,000.00 of building remodeling and improvement projects, consisting of projects included in the District's 2020-2021 building remodeling and improvement program, and paying certain costs of issuance;

"<u>Purchase Price</u>" shall mean \$1,559,916.00 (\$1,500,000.00 par amount of Notes, <u>plus</u> premium of \$64,266.00, <u>less</u> underwriter's discount of \$4,350.00);

"<u>Record Date</u>" shall mean the close of business on the fifteenth day of the calendar month next preceding any principal or interest payment date;

"<u>Securities Depository</u>" means The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, or its nominee; and

"<u>Underwriter</u>" means Raymond James & Associates Inc.

Section 2. <u>Authorization of the Notes</u>. For the purpose of financing the Public Purposes, there shall be borrowed on the full faith and credit of the District the sum of \$1,500,000.00; and fully registered general obligation promissory notes of the District are authorized to be issued in evidence thereof.

Section 3. <u>Sale of the Notes</u>. To evidence such indebtedness, (i) the Chairperson or the Vice Chairperson and (ii) the Secretary of the District are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute, issue and sell to the Underwriter for, on behalf of and in the name of the District, general obligation promissory notes in the aggregate principal amount of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) for the Purchase Price, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery.

Section 4. <u>Terms of the Notes</u>. The Notes shall be designated "General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2020-21H"; shall be dated the Dated Date; shall be numbered one and upward; shall bear interest as shown on the Maturity Schedule below; shall be issued in denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof; and shall mature on the dates and in the amounts as set forth below. Interest on the Notes shall accrue from the Interest Accrual Date and shall be payable semi-annually on June 1 and December 1 of each year, commencing on June 1, 2021.

The Notes of this issue shall not be subject to call and payment prior to maturity.

Section 5. <u>Form, Execution, Registration and Payment of the Notes</u>. The Notes shall be issued as registered obligations in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> and incorporated herein by this reference.

The Notes shall be executed in the name of the District by the manual signatures of (i) the Chairperson or the Vice Chairperson and (ii) the Secretary or other officer, and may be sealed with its official or corporate seal, if any.

The principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Notes shall be paid by the Fiscal Agent.

Both the principal of and interest on the Notes shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America by the Fiscal Agent. Payment of principal of the final maturity on the Notes will be payable upon presentation and surrender of the Notes to the Fiscal Agent. Payment of principal on the Notes (except the final maturity) and each installment of interest shall be made to the registered owner of each Note who shall appear on the registration books of the District, maintained by the Note Registrar, on the Record Date and shall be paid by check or draft of the Fiscal Agent and mailed to such registered owner at the address appearing on such registration books or at such other address may be furnished in writing to such registered owner to the Note Registrar.

Section 6. <u>Note Proceeds</u>. The sale proceeds of the Notes (exclusive of accrued interest, printing distribution and filing fees, and any premium received) shall, forthwith upon receipt, be placed in and kept by the District Treasurer as a separate fund to be known as the Promissory Notes, Series 2020-21H, Borrowed Money Fund (hereinafter referred to as the "Borrowed Money Fund"). Moneys in the Borrowed Money Fund shall be used solely for the purposes for which borrowed or for transfer to the Debt Service Fund as provided by law.

Section 7. <u>Tax Levy</u>. In order to provide for the collection of a direct annual tax sufficient in amount to pay and for the express purpose of paying the interest on the Notes as it falls due and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof at maturity, there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property in the District, in addition to all other taxes, a nonrepealable, direct, annual tax in an amount sufficient for that purpose. This tax shall be from year to year carried into the tax roll of the District and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time. Said tax is to be for the following years and in the following minimum amounts:

The District shall be and continue without power to repeal such levy or obstruct the collection of said tax until all such payments have been made or provided for. After the issuance of the Notes, said tax shall be carried into the tax rolls of the District and collected as other taxes are collected, provided that the amount of tax carried into said tax rolls with respect to the Notes may be reduced by the amount of any surplus money in the Debt Service Fund created pursuant to Section 8 below.

If there shall be insufficient funds from the tax levy to pay the principal of or interest on the Notes when due, the said principal or interest shall be paid from other funds of the District on hand, said amounts to be returned when said taxes have been collected.

There be and there hereby is appropriated from taxes levied by the District in anticipation of the issuance of the Notes and other funds of the District on hand a sum sufficient to be deposited in the Debt Service Fund to meet payments with respect to debt service due for the year 2021.

Section 8. <u>Debt Service Fund</u>. Within the debt service fund previously established within the treasury of the District, there be and there hereby is established a separate and distinct fund designated as the "Debt Service Fund for \$1,500,000.00 General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2020-21H, dated February 10, 2021" (the "Debt Service Fund"), and such fund shall be maintained until the indebtedness evidenced by the Notes is fully paid or otherwise extinguished. The District Treasurer shall deposit in such Debt Service Fund (i) all accrued interest received by the District at the time of delivery of and payment for the Notes; (ii) the taxes herein levied for the specific purpose of meeting principal of and interest on the Notes when due; (iii) such other sums as may be necessary at any time to pay principal of and interest on the Notes when due; (iv) any premium which may be received by the District above the par value of the Notes; and (vi) such further deposits as may be required by Section 67.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

No money shall be withdrawn from the Debt Service Fund and appropriated for any purpose other than the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes until all such principal and interest has been paid in full and canceled; provided (i) the funds to provide for each payment of principal of and interest on the Notes prior to the scheduled receipt of taxes from the next succeeding tax collection may be invested in direct obligations of the United States of America maturing in time to make such payments when they are due or in other investments permitted by law; and (ii) any funds over and above the amount of such principal and interest payments on the Notes may be used to reduce the next succeeding tax levy, or may, at the option of the District, be invested by purchasing the Notes as permitted by and subject to Section 67.11(2)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes in interest-bearing obligations of the United States of America, in other obligations of the District or in other investments permitted by law, which investments shall continue as a part of the Debt Service Fund.

When all of the Notes have been paid in full and canceled, and all permitted investments disposed of, any money remaining in the Debt Service Fund shall be deposited in the general fund of the District, unless the District Board directs otherwise.

Section 9. <u>Deposits and Investments</u>. The Debt Service Fund shall be kept apart from moneys in the other funds and accounts of the District and the same shall be used for no purpose other than the prompt payment of principal of and interest on the Notes as the same becomes due and payable. All moneys therein shall be deposited in special and segregated accounts in a public depository selected under Chapter 34 of the Wisconsin Statutes and may be temporarily invested until needed in legal investments subject to the provisions of Sections 66.0603(1m) and 67.10(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes. All income derived from such investments shall be regarded as revenues of the District. No such investment shall be in such a manner as would cause the Notes to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code or the Regulations of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue thereunder.

The District Treasurer shall, on the basis of the facts, estimates and circumstances in existence on the date of closing, make such certifications as are necessary to permit the

conclusion that the Notes are not "arbitrage bonds" under Section 148 of the Code or the Regulations of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue thereunder.

Section 10. <u>Sale of Notes</u>. The terms, conditions and provisions of the Notes and the Note Documents are, in all respects, authorized and approved. The form of the Note Purchase Agreement is hereby approved. The Notes shall be sold and delivered in the manner, at the Purchase Price, plus interest accrued from the Interest Accrual Date to the closing date, pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the Note Purchase Agreement.

The preparation of the Preliminary Official Statement and the Final Official Statement, and their use as contemplated in the Note Purchase Agreement, are hereby approved. The Preliminary Official Statement is "deemed final" as of its date, except for omissions or subsequent modifications permitted under Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission. The Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson and Secretary of the District are authorized and directed to do any and all acts necessary to conclude delivery of the Notes to the Underwriter, as soon after adoption of this Resolution as is convenient.

Section 11. <u>Book-Entry Only Notes</u>. The Notes shall be transferable as follows:

Each maturity of Notes will be issued as a single Note in the name of the (a) Securities Depository, or its nominee, which will act as depository for the Notes. During the term of the Notes, ownership and subsequent transfers of ownership will be reflected by book entry on the records of the Securities Depository and those financial institutions for whom the Securities Depository effects book entry transfers (collectively, the "Participants"). No person for whom a Participant has an interest in Notes (a "Beneficial Owner") shall receive bond certificates representing their respective interest in the Notes except in the event that the Securities Depository or the District shall determine, at its option, to terminate the book-entry system described in this Section. Payment of principal of, and interest on, the Notes will be made by the Fiscal Agent to the Securities Depository which will in turn remit such payment of principal and interest to its Participants which will in turn remit such principal and interest to the Beneficial Owners of the Notes until and unless the Securities Depository or the District elect to terminate the book entry system, whereupon the District shall deliver bond certificates to the Beneficial Owners of the Notes or their nominees. Note certificates issued under this Section may not be transferred or exchanged except as provided in this Section.

(b) Upon the reduction of the principal amount of any maturity of Notes, the Registered Noteowner may make a notation of such redemption on the panel of the Note, stating the amount so redeemed, or may return the Note to the District for exchange for a new Note in a proper principal amount. Such notation, if made by the Noteowner, may be made for reference only, and may not be relied upon by any other person as being in any way determinative of the principal amount of such Note Outstanding, unless the Note Registrar initialed the notation on the panel.

(c) Immediately upon delivery of the Notes to the purchasers thereof on the

delivery date, such purchasers shall deposit the bond certificates representing all of the Notes with the Securities Depository. The Securities Depository, or its nominee, will be the sole Noteowner of the Notes, and no investor or other party purchasing, selling or otherwise transferring ownership of any Notes will receive, hold or deliver any bond certificates as long as the Securities Depository holds the Notes immobilized from circulation.

(d) The Notes may not be transferred or exchanged except:

(1) To any successor of the Securities Depository (or its nominee) or any substitute depository ("Substitute Depository") designated pursuant to (ii) below, provided that any successor of the Securities Depository or any Substitute Depository must be a qualified and registered "clearing agency" as provided in Section 17L of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended;

(2) To a Substitute Depository designated by or acceptable to the District upon (a) the determination by the Securities Depository that the Notes shall no longer be eligible for depository services or (b) a determination by the District that the Securities Depository is no longer able to carry out its functions, provided that any such Substitute Depository must be qualified to act as such, as provided in subparagraph (1) above; or

(3) To those persons to whom transfer is requested in written transfer instructions in the event that:

(i) The Securities Depository shall resign or discontinue its services for the Notes and, only if the District is unable to locate a qualified successor within two months following the resignation or determination of noneligibility, or

(ii) Upon a determination by the District that the continuation of the book entry system described herein, which precludes the issuance of certificates to any Noteowner other than the Securities Depository (or its nominee) is no longer in the best interest of the Beneficial Owners of the Notes.

(e) The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, is hereby appointed the Securities Depository for the Notes.

Section 12. <u>Undertaking to Provide Continuing Disclosure</u>. The (i) Chairperson or the Vice Chairperson and (ii) Secretary of the District are hereby authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the District, the Continuing Disclosure Agreement in connection with the Notes for the purpose of complying with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended.

Section 13. Compliance with Federal Tax Laws.

(a) The District represents and covenants that the project financed by the Notes and their ownership, management and use will not cause the Notes to be "private activity bonds" within the meaning of Section 141 of the Code, and the District shall comply with the provisions of the Code to the extent necessary to maintain the tax-exempt status of the interest on the Notes.

(b) The District also covenants to use its best efforts to meet the requirements and restrictions of any different or additional federal legislation which may be made applicable to the Notes, provided that in meeting such requirements the District will do so only to the extent consistent with the proceedings authorizing the Notes and the laws of Wisconsin, and to the extent there is a reasonable period of time in which to comply.

Section 14. <u>Rebate Fund</u>. If necessary, the District shall establish and maintain, so long as the Notes are outstanding, a separate account to be known as the "Rebate Fund" for the purpose of complying with the rebate requirements of Section 148(f) of the Code. The Rebate Fund is for the sole purpose of paying rebate to the United States of America, if any, on amounts of bond proceeds held by the District. The District hereby covenants and agrees that it shall pay from the Rebate Fund the rebate amounts as determined herein to the United States of America.

The District may engage the services of accountants, attorneys, or other consultants necessary to assist it in determining rebate amounts. Amounts held in the Rebate Fund and the investment income therefrom are not pledged as security for the Notes and may only be used to pay amounts to the United States. The District shall maintain or cause to be maintained records of such determinations until six (6) years after payment in full of the Notes and shall make such records available upon reasonable request therefor.

Section 15. <u>Defeasance</u>. When all Notes have been discharged, all pledges, covenants and other rights granted to the owners thereof by this Resolution shall cease. The District may discharge all Notes due on any date by irrevocably depositing in escrow with a suitable bank or trust company a sum of cash and/or bonds or securities issued or guaranteed as to principal and interest of the U.S. Government, or of a commission, board or other instrumentality of the U.S. Government ("Government Obligations"), or of securities wholly and irrevocably secured as to principal and interest by Government Obligations and rated in the highest rating category of a nationally recognized rating service, maturing on the dates and bearing interest at the rates required to provide funds sufficient to pay when due the interest to accrue on each of said Note to its maturity or, at the District's option, if said Note is prepayable to any prior date upon which it may be called for redemption, and to pay and redeem the principal amount of each such Note at maturity, or at the District's option, if said Note is prepayable, at its earliest redemption date, with the premium required for such redemption, if any, provided that notice of the redemption of all prepayable Notes on such date has been duly given or provided for.

Section 16. <u>Resolution a Contract</u>. The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the District and the owner or owners of the Notes, and after issuance of any of the Notes no change or alteration of any kind in the provisions of this Resolution may be made, except as provided in Section 18, until all of the Notes have been paid in full as to both principal and interest. The owner or owners of any of the Notes shall have the right in addition to all other rights, by mandamus or other suit or action in any court of competent jurisdiction, to enforce such owner's or owners' rights against the District, the Governing Body thereof, and any and all officers and agents thereof including, but without limitation, the right to require the District, its Governing Body and any other authorized body, to fix and collect rates and charges fully adequate to carry out all of the provisions and agreements contained in this Resolution.

Section 17. <u>General Authorizations</u>. The Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson and the Secretary of the District and the appropriate deputies and officials of the District in accordance with their assigned responsibilities are hereby each authorized to execute, deliver, publish, file and record such other documents, instruments, notices and records and to take such other actions as shall be necessary or desirable to accomplish the purposes of this Resolution and to comply with and perform the obligations of the District under the Notes. The execution or written approval of any document by the Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson or Secretary of the District herein authorized shall be conclusive evidence of the approval by the District of such document in accordance with the terms hereof.

In the event that said officers shall be unable by reason of death, disability, absence or vacancy of office to perform in timely fashion any of the duties specified herein (such as the execution of Notes), such duties shall be performed by the officer or official succeeding to such duties in accordance with law and the rules of the District.

Any actions taken by the Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson and Secretary consistent with this Resolution are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 18. <u>Amendment to Resolution</u>. After the issuance of any of the Notes, no change or alteration of any kind in the provisions of this Resolution may be made until all of the Notes have been paid in full as to both principal and interest, or discharged as herein provided, except: (a) the District may, from to time, amend this Resolution without the consent of any of the owners of the Notes, but only to cure any ambiguity, administrative conflict, formal defect, or omission or procedural inconsistency of this Resolution; and (b) this Resolution may be amended, in any respect, with a written consent of the owners of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the principal amount of the Notes then outstanding; provided, however, that no amendment shall permit any change in the pledge of tax revenues of the District or the maturity of any Note issued hereunder, or a reduction in the amount of the redemption premium payable in the case of redemption thereof, or change the terms upon which the Notes may be redeemed or make any other modification in the terms of the payment of such principal or interest without the written consent of the owner of each such Note to which the change is applicable.

Section 19. <u>Illegal or Invalid Provisions</u>. In case any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution or any of the Notes shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution or of the Notes.

Section 20. <u>Conflicting Resolutions</u>. All ordinances, resolutions, or orders, or parts thereof heretofore enacted, adopted or entered, in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, are hereby repealed and this Resolution shall be in effect from and after its passage.

New York, January 15, 2021 -- Moody's Investors Service assigns a Aa1 rating to Milwaukee Area Technical College District, WI's (MATC) \$1.5 million General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2020-21H and \$6.5 million Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds. We maintain the Aa1 rating on the district's outstanding general obligation unlimited tax (GOULT) debt. Following the sale, the district will have \$104.3 million of outstanding GOULT debt, all rated by Moody's. The outlook is stable.

RATINGS RATIONALE

The Aa1 rating reflects the district's strong financial position bolstered by recent operating surpluses. While the coronavirus is driving an unprecedented economic downturn, the district's solid operating reserves and proactive management will provide a buffer against any near-term impacts of the pandemic. The rating also incorporates the district's large and diverse tax base encompassing the greater City of Milwaukee (A2 negative) region, modest socioeconomic indices, limited revenue raising flexibility, modest debt burden, and moderate pension burden.

RATING OUTLOOK

The stable outlook reflects our expectation that the district will maintain financial operations in line with the current rating through prudent management of expenditures, which is critical given the district's limited revenue raising flexibility and trend of declining enrollment.

FACTORS THAT COULD LEAD TO AN UPGRADE OF THE RATINGS

-Significant improvement in resident demographic profile

-Enhanced budgetary flexibility that could arise from growing enrollment or relaxed statutory restrictions on raising local revenue

Milwaukee Area Technical College District is one of the largest technical college systems in Wisconsin (Aa1 stable), providing vocational education to residents of Milwaukee County (Aa2 stable), the majority of Ozaukee County (Aaa stable) and small portions of several other surrounding suburban counties.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF \$6,345,000.00 <u>TAXABLE GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS</u> (F0167-01-21)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 67.12(12) and 67.05 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as amended (the "Act"), the Milwaukee Area Technical College District, Wisconsin (the "District"), is authorized to issue bonds of the District in the aggregate amount of \$6,345,000.00 for the public purpose of advance refunding a portion of the District's Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2012-13E, and paying certain costs of issuance (the public purposes described above are hereafter referred to as the "Public Purposes"); and

WHEREAS, on September 25, 2012, the District authorized the issuance of \$10,000,000.00 Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2012-13E (the "Prior Bonds");

WHEREAS, on the date hereof, the District shall agree to issue its \$6,345,000.00 Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds (the "Bonds") to advance refund a portion of the Prior Bonds;

WHEREAS, the District has prepared and distributed a Preliminary Official Statement, dated January 19, 2021 (the "Preliminary Official Statement"), describing the Bonds and the security therefor; and

WHEREAS, the District has examined proposed documentation for the Bonds (collectively, the "Bond Documents"), as follows:

(a) an Official Notice of Sale issued by the District and a Parity Bid Form (the "Bond Purchase Agreement") to be entered into between the District and the Underwriter, providing for the sale of the Bonds; and

(b) the Preliminary Official Statement.

WHEREAS, it is now expedient and necessary for the District to issue its taxable general obligation bonds in the amount of \$6,345,000.00 for the Public Purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, the District hereby resolves as follows:

Section 1. <u>Definitions</u>. The following terms shall have the following meanings in this Resolution unless the text expressly or by implication requires otherwise:

"Act" shall mean Section 67.12(12) and 67.05 of the Wisconsin Statutes;

"<u>Code</u>" shall mean the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

"<u>Continuing Disclosure Agreement</u>" shall mean the Continuing Disclosure Agreement, executed and delivered by the Issuer, dated February 10, 2021 (the "Continuing Disclosure Agreement"), delivered by the District for the purpose of complying with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended;

"Dated Date" shall mean February 10, 2021;

"<u>Debt Service Fund</u>" shall mean the Debt Service Fund of the District, which shall be the "special redemption fund" as such term is defined in the Act;

"District" shall mean the Milwaukee Area Technical College District, Wisconsin;

"<u>Escrow Agent</u>" shall mean such other entity as the District may approve to act as escrow agent for the Bonds;

"<u>Fiscal Agent</u>" shall mean the Treasurer of the District or such other entity as the District may approve to act as fiscal agent;

"<u>Governing Body</u>" shall mean the Board of the District, or such other body as may hereafter be the chief legislative body of the District;

"Bond Registrar" means the Secretary of the District;

"<u>Bonds</u>" shall mean the \$6,345,000.00 Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds of the District;

"<u>Public Purposes</u>" shall mean the public purpose of advance refunding a portion of the District's Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2012-13E, and paying certain costs of issuance;

"<u>Purchase Price</u>" shall mean \$6,383,893.27 (\$6,345,000.00 par amount of Bonds, <u>plus</u> premium of \$66,163.30, <u>less</u> underwriter's discount of \$27,270.03);

"<u>Record Date</u>" shall mean the close of business on the fifteenth day of the calendar month next preceding any principal or interest payment date;

"<u>Securities Depository</u>" means The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, or its nominee; and

"<u>Underwriter</u>" means BOK Financial Securities, Inc.

Section 2. <u>Authorization of the Bonds</u>. For the purpose of financing the Public Purposes, there shall be borrowed on the full faith and credit of the District the sum of \$6,345,000.00; and fully registered taxable general obligation bonds of the District are authorized to be issued in evidence thereof.

Section 3. <u>Sale of the Bonds</u>. To evidence such indebtedness, (i) the Chairperson or the Vice Chairperson and (ii) the Secretary of the District or other officer are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute, issue and sell to the Underwriter for, on behalf of and in the name of the District, taxable general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount of Six Million Three Hundred Forty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$6,345,000.00) for the Purchase Price, plus accrued interest to the date of delivery.

Section 4. <u>Terms of the Bonds</u>. The Bonds shall be designated "Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds"; shall be dated the Dated Date; shall be numbered one and upward; shall bear interest as shown on the Maturity Schedule below; shall be issued in denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof; and shall mature on the dates and in the amounts as set forth below. Interest on the Bonds shall accrue from the Interest Accrual Date and shall be payable semi-annually on June 1 and December 1 of each year, commencing on June 1, 2021.

MATURITY SCHEDULE

The Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2030 shall be subject to call and prior payment, at the option of the District on June 1, 2029 or on any date thereafter, in each case in whole or in part, and if in part, from maturities selected by the District and by lot within each maturity at a price of par plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

Section 5. <u>Form, Execution, Registration and Payment of the Bonds</u>. The Bonds shall be issued as registered obligations in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> and incorporated herein by this reference.

The Bonds shall be executed in the name of the District by the manual signatures of (i) the Chairperson or the Vice Chairperson and (ii) the Secretary or other officer, and may be sealed with its official or corporate seal, if any.

The principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds shall be paid by the Fiscal Agent. The Escrow Agent shall hold the funds to be used to advance refund the Prior Bonds.

Both the principal of and interest on the Bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America by the Fiscal Agent or Escrow Agent, as applicable. Payment of principal of the final maturity on the Bonds will be payable upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds to the Fiscal Agent. Payment of principal on the Bonds (except the final maturity) and each installment of interest shall be made to the registered owner of each Bond who shall appear on the registration books of the District, maintained by the Bond Registrar, on the Record Date and shall be paid by check or draft of the Escrow Agent or Fiscal Agent and mailed to such registered owner at the address appearing on such registration books or at such other address may be furnished in writing to such registered owner to the Bond Registrar.

Section 6. <u>Bond Proceeds</u>. The sale proceeds of the Bonds (exclusive of accrued interest, printing distribution and filing fees, and any premium received) shall, forthwith upon receipt, be placed in and kept by the Escrow Agent as a separate fund to be known as the Escrow Fund (hereinafter referred to as the "Escrow Fund"). Moneys in the Escrow Fund shall be used solely for the purposes for which borrowed.

Section 7. <u>Tax Levy</u>. In order to provide for the collection of a direct annual tax sufficient in amount to pay and for the express purpose of paying the interest on the Bonds as it falls due and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof at maturity, there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property in the District, in addition to all other taxes, a nonrepealable, direct, annual tax in an amount sufficient for that purpose. This tax shall be from year to year carried into the tax roll of the District and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time. Said tax is to be for the following years and in the following minimum amounts:

The District shall be and continue without power to repeal such levy or obstruct the collection of said tax until all such payments have been made or provided for. After the issuance of the Bonds, said tax shall be carried into the tax rolls of the District and collected as other taxes are collected, provided that the amount of tax carried into said tax rolls with respect to the Bonds may be reduced by the amount of any surplus money in the Debt Service Fund created pursuant to Section 8 below.

If there shall be insufficient funds from the tax levy to pay the principal of or interest on the Bonds when due, the said principal or interest shall be paid from other funds of the District on hand, said amounts to be returned when said taxes have been collected.

There be and there hereby is appropriated from taxes levied by the District in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and other funds of the District on hand a sum sufficient to be deposited in the Debt Service Fund to meet payments with respect to debt service due for the year 2021.

Section 8. <u>Debt Service Fund</u>. Within the debt service fund previously established within the treasury of the District, there be and there hereby is established a separate and distinct fund designated as the "Debt Service Fund for \$6,345,000.00 Taxable General Obligation Refunding Bonds, dated February 10, 2021" (the "Debt Service Fund"), and such fund shall be maintained until the indebtedness evidenced by the Bonds is fully paid or otherwise extinguished. The District Treasurer shall deposit in such Debt Service Fund (i) all accrued interest received by the District at the time of delivery of and payment for the Bonds; (ii) the taxes herein levied for the specific purpose of meeting principal of and interest on the Bonds when due; (iii) such other sums as may be necessary at any time to pay principal of and interest on the Bonds when due; (iv) any premium which may be received by the District above the par value of the Bonds and accrued interest thereon; (v) surplus moneys in the Escrow Fund for the Bonds; and (vi) such further deposits as may be required by Section 67.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

No money shall be withdrawn from the Debt Service Fund and appropriated for any purpose other than the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds until all such principal and interest has been paid in full and canceled; provided (i) the funds to provide for each payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds prior to the scheduled receipt of taxes from the next succeeding tax collection may be invested in direct obligations of the United States of America maturing in time to make such payments when they are due or in other investments permitted by law; and (ii) any funds over and above the amount of such principal and interest payments on the Bonds may be used to reduce the next succeeding tax levy, or may, at the option of the District, be invested by purchasing the Bonds as permitted by and subject to Section 67.11(2)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes in interest-bearing obligations of the United States of America, in other obligations of the District or in other investments permitted by law, which investments shall continue as a part of the Debt Service Fund.

When all of the Bonds have been paid in full and canceled, and all permitted investments disposed of, any money remaining in the Debt Service Fund shall be deposited in the general fund of the District, unless the District Board directs otherwise.

Section 9. <u>Deposits and Investments</u>. The Debt Service Fund shall be kept apart from moneys in the other funds and accounts of the District and the same shall be used for no purpose other than the prompt payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same becomes due and payable. All moneys therein shall be deposited in special and segregated accounts in a public depository selected under Chapter 34 of the Wisconsin Statutes and may be temporarily invested until needed in legal investments subject to the provisions of Sections 66.0603(1m) and 67.10(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes. All income derived from such investments shall be regarded as revenues of the District.

Section 10. <u>Sale of Bonds</u>. The terms, conditions and provisions of the Bonds and the Bond Documents are, in all respects, authorized and approved. The form of the Bond Purchase Agreement is hereby approved. The Bonds shall be sold and delivered in the manner, at the Purchase Price, plus interest accrued from the Interest Accrual Date to the closing date, pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement.

The preparation of the Preliminary Official Statement and the Final Official Statement, and their use as contemplated in the Bond Purchase Agreement, are hereby approved. The Preliminary Official Statement is "deemed final" as of its date, except for omissions or subsequent modifications permitted under Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission. The Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson and Secretary or other officer of the District are authorized and directed to do any and all acts necessary to conclude delivery of the Bonds to the Underwriter, as soon after adoption of this Resolution as is convenient.

Section 11. <u>Book-Entry Only Bonds</u>. The Bonds shall be transferable as follows:

(a) Each maturity of Bonds will be issued as a single Bond in the name of the Securities Depository, or its nominee, which will act as depository for the Bonds. During the term of the Bonds, ownership and subsequent transfers of ownership will be reflected by book entry on the records of the Securities Depository and those financial institutions for whom the Securities Depository effects book entry transfers (collectively, the "Participants"). No person for whom a Participant has an interest in Bonds (a "Beneficial Owner") shall receive bond certificates representing their respective interest in the Bonds except in the event that the Securities Depository or the District shall determine, at its option, to terminate the book-entry system described in this Section. Payment of principal of, and interest on, the Bonds will be made by the Fiscal Agent to the Securities Depository which will in turn remit such payment of principal and interest to its Participants which will in turn remit such payment of principal and interest to the Beneficial Owners of the Bonds until and unless the Securities Depository or the District elect to terminate the book entry system, whereupon the District shall deliver bond certificates to the Beneficial Owners of the Bonds until and unless

or their nominees. Bond certificates issued under this Section may not be transferred or exchanged except as provided in this Section.

(b) Upon the reduction of the principal amount of any maturity of Bonds, the Registered Bondowner may make a notation of such redemption on the panel of the Bond, stating the amount so redeemed, or may return the Bond to the District for exchange for a new Bond in a proper principal amount. Such notation, if made by the Bondowner, may be made for reference only, and may not be relied upon by any other person as being in any way determinative of the principal amount of such Bond Outstanding, unless the Bond Registrar initialed the notation on the panel.

(c) Immediately upon delivery of the Bonds to the purchasers thereof on the delivery date, such purchasers shall deposit the bond certificates representing all of the Bonds with the Securities Depository. The Securities Depository, or its nominee, will be the sole Bondowner of the Bonds, and no investor or other party purchasing, selling or otherwise transferring ownership of any Bonds will receive, hold or deliver any bond certificates as long as the Securities Depository holds the Bonds immobilized from circulation.

(d) The Bonds may not be transferred or exchanged except:

(1) To any successor of the Securities Depository (or its nominee) or any substitute depository ("Substitute Depository") designated pursuant to (ii) below, provided that any successor of the Securities Depository or any Substitute Depository must be a qualified and registered "clearing agency" as provided in Section 17L of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended;

(2) To a Substitute Depository designated by or acceptable to the District upon (a) the determination by the Securities Depository that the Bonds shall no longer be eligible for depository services or (b) a determination by the District that the Securities Depository is no longer able to carry out its functions, provided that any such Substitute Depository must be qualified to act as such, as provided in subparagraph (1) above; or

(3) To those persons to whom transfer is requested in written transfer instructions in the event that:

(i) The Securities Depository shall resign or discontinue its services for the Bonds and, only if the District is unable to locate a qualified successor within two months following the resignation or determination of noneligibility, or

(ii) Upon a determination by the District that the continuation of the book entry system described herein, which precludes the issuance of certificates to any Bondowner other than the Securities Depository (or its

nominee) is no longer in the best interest of the Beneficial Owners of the Bonds.

(e) The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York, is hereby appointed the Securities Depository for the Bonds.

Section 12. <u>Undertaking to Provide Continuing Disclosure</u>. The (i) Chairperson or the Vice Chairperson and (ii) Secretary of the District are hereby authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the District, the Continuing Disclosure Agreement in connection with the Bonds for the purpose of complying with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended.

Section 13. <u>Defeasance</u>. When all Bonds have been discharged, all pledges, covenants and other rights granted to the owners thereof by this Resolution shall cease. The District may discharge all Bonds due on any date by irrevocably depositing in escrow with a suitable bank or trust company a sum of cash and/or bonds or securities issued or guaranteed as to principal and interest of the U.S. Government, or of a commission, board or other instrumentality of the U.S. Government ("Government Obligations"), or of securities wholly and irrevocably secured as to principal and interest by Government Obligations and rated in the highest rating category of a nationally recognized rating service, maturing on the dates and bearing interest at the rates required to provide funds sufficient to pay when due the interest to accrue on each of said Bond to its maturity or, at the District's option, if said Bond is prepayable to any prior date upon which it may be called for redemption, and to pay and redeem the principal amount of each such Bond at maturity, or at the District's option, if said Bond is prepayable, at its earliest redemption date, with the premium required for such redemption, if any, provided that notice of the redemption of all prepayable Bonds on such date has been duly given or provided for.

Section 14. <u>Resolution a Contract</u>. The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the District and the owner or owners of the Bonds, and after issuance of any of the Bonds no change or alteration of any kind in the provisions of this Resolution may be made, except as provided in Section 16, until all of the Bonds have been paid in full as to both principal and interest. The owner or owners of any of the Bonds shall have the right in addition to all other rights, by mandamus or other suit or action in any court of competent jurisdiction, to enforce such owner's or owners' rights against the District, the Governing Body thereof, and any and all officers and agents thereof including, but without limitation, the right to require the District, its Governing Body and any other authorized body, to fix and collect rates and charges fully adequate to carry out all of the provisions and agreements contained in this Resolution.

Section 15. <u>General Authorizations</u>. The Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson and the Secretary of the District and the appropriate deputies and officials of the District in accordance with their assigned responsibilities are hereby each authorized to execute, deliver, publish, file and record such other documents, instruments, notices and records

and to take such other actions as shall be necessary or desirable to accomplish the purposes of this Resolution and to comply with and perform the obligations of the District under the Bonds. The execution or written approval of any document by the Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson or Secretary of the District herein authorized shall be conclusive evidence of the approval by the District of such document in accordance with the terms hereof.

In the event that said officers shall be unable by reason of death, disability, absence or vacancy of office to perform in timely fashion any of the duties specified herein (such as the execution of Bonds), such duties shall be performed by the officer or official succeeding to such duties in accordance with law and the rules of the District.

Any actions taken by the Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson and Secretary consistent with this Resolution are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 16. <u>Amendment to Resolution</u>. After the issuance of any of the Bonds, no change or alteration of any kind in the provisions of this Resolution may be made until all of the Bonds have been paid in full as to both principal and interest, or discharged as herein provided, except: (a) the District may, from to time, amend this Resolution without the consent of any of the owners of the Bonds, but only to cure any ambiguity, administrative conflict, formal defect, or omission or procedural inconsistency of this Resolution; and (b) this Resolution may be amended, in any respect, with a written consent of the owners of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the principal amount of the Bonds then outstanding; provided, however, that no amendment shall permit any change in the pledge of tax revenues of the District or the maturity of any Bond issued hereunder, or a reduction in the amount of the redemption premium payable in the case of redemption thereof, or change the terms upon which the Bonds may be redeemed or make any other modification in the terms of the payment of such principal or interest without the written consent of the owner of each such Bond to which the change is applicable.

Section 17. <u>Illegal or Invalid Provisions</u>. In case any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution or any of the Bonds shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution or of the Bonds.

Section 18. <u>Conflicting Resolutions</u>. All ordinances, resolutions, or orders, or parts thereof heretofore enacted, adopted or entered, in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, are hereby repealed and this Resolution shall be in effect from and after its passage.

Resolution (F0168-01-21) to Approve Associate Degree Program Titled Diagnostic Medical Sonography (10-526-2)

Background Information:

Upon recommendation of the Radiography Advisory Committee, the Healthcare Pathway investigated the potential for implementation of a Diagnostic Medical Sonography AAS degree. Diagnostic Medical Sonographers (DMS) use high frequency sound waves to produce images of organs, masses, fluid collection and vascular structures within the human body. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the job outlook for the years 2019-2029 will see a 12% increase (much faster than average). BLS also indicated that the median annual wage for diagnostic medical sonographers was \$74,320. Although in Milwaukee and Ozaukee Counties, the median is \$89,088.

Additionally, through EMSI analysis for Milwaukee and Ozaukee Counties, it is clear the need far outweighs the available workforce. Job postings for these positions last for an average of 46 days as these positions are difficult to fill. DMS professionals typically work in hospital and clinic settings.

At MATC, there is potential for a partnership with Froedtert Hospital to develop a partnership to train DMS students. These talks are currently underway. Additionally, students could progress toward a B.S. in any number of programs like Sonography, Healthcare Administration, Radiography and Health Sciences to name a few.

This curriculum is already state aligned and has been implemented at Blackhawk Technical College and Northeastern Wisconsin Technical College.

Program and Credential: MATC is developing a Diagnostic Medical Sonography program utilizing WTCS state aligned curriculum. The credential awarded will be Associate in Applied Sciences (AAS). The Pathway Tracks are illustrated in the Healthcare Pathway Health Promotion Diagram.

Diagnostic medical sonography and ultrasound uses high frequency sound waves to produce images of organs, masses, fluid collections, and vascular structures within the human body. The sonographer is responsible for obtaining pertinent patient history, performing the sonographic examination, providing for the needs and comfort of the patient during the examination, and recording anatomy and pathology or other data for interpretation by the supervising physician to aid in diagnosis. Sonography is commonly used in the field of obstetrics and gynecology.

Current and Projected Need:

According to the Us. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the job outlook for Diagnostic Medical Sonographers is expected to increase by 12% from 2019-2029 which is must faster than average. As the large baby boom population ages, the need to diagnose medical conditions such as blood clots and heart disease will likely increase. Diagnostic imaging is a tool utilized in making these diagnoses.

According to Emsi Occupational overview, In Wisconsin, the expected salary for Diagnostic Medical Sonographers sits at about \$89,088 annually. This is higher than the national average of \$74,320 listed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The monthly unique job postings far outweigh the number of individuals hired for these positions. The demand is great for these professionals. In addition to this information, the Radiography Technician Program Advisory Committee suggested and approved the investigation and addition of the DMS program at MATC.

As Technical Colleges, our mission is to provide credentials that meet the needs of employers and customers and provide our communities with a skilled workforce. MATC has a standard process for initiating new programming. The first step is research completed by the Institutional Research Department.

This along with the analysis of this program supporting the employment department can be found in a variety of government and EMSI employment data, including job postings. This information, along with the existence of a Diagnostic Medical Sonography program at Fox Valley Technical College and Northeast Wisconsin Technical College in the WTCS, provided enough evidence to pursue investigation of the program. Dean of the Healthcare Pathway Dr. Kelly Dries tasked Director of Clinical Education and Compliance with investigating a DMS program for MATC, and Wendy Kong, faculty member was enlisted to develop the curriculum utilizing the State Aligned WTCS curriculum as a guide.

Partnerships/Advisory Group:

As indicated earlier, MATC held an advisory specific to the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program in October 2020. Participation in an Advisory committee for the program as soon as it is approved by the WTCS. Advisory Committees at the college are key assets in providing expertise, support and assurance that the program is maintaining currency in industry standards. The Advisory Committee also is a valuable resource for networking when assisting students in practicum placements. Advisory Committees at the college routinely meet twice per year, but members are available for consultation via webinars or conference calls if necessary, throughout the year, which is particularly important when developing a new program.

Articulation:

Currently MATC has articulation agreements with 31 colleges offering baccalaureate credentials. We plan to open discussions with our local four-year colleges to discuss the new program and potentials for transferability. We already have the concept map presented outlining potential articulations with UW-Milwaukee, Mount Mary University, Marquette University, Medical College of Wisconsin and Cardinal Stritch University. MATC works diligently to provide graduates options for further education.













Retirement Risk Is About Average, While Overall Diversity Is Low





Occupation Race/Ethnicity Breakdown





Location Quotient

Diagnostic medical sonographers and cardiovascular technologists and technicians, including vascular technologists, also called diagnostic imaging workers, operate special imaging equipment to create images or conduct tests. The images and test results help physicians assess and diagnose medical conditions. Sonographers and technologists may work closely with <u>physicians and surgeons</u> before, during, and after procedures.

Diagnostic sonographers use high-frequency sound waves to produce images of the inside of the body.

Diagnostic medical sonographers specialize in creating images of the body's organs and tissues. The images are known as sonograms or ultrasounds. Sonograms are often the first imaging tests performed when disease is suspected.

Diagnostic sonography uses high-frequency sound waves to produce images of the inside of the body. The sonographer uses an instrument called an ultrasound transducer to scan parts of the patient's body that are being examined. The transducer emits pulses of sound that bounce back, causing echoes. The echoes are then sent to an ultrasound machine, which processes them and displays them as images used by physicians for diagnosis.

The following are examples of types of diagnostic medical sonographers:

- Abdominal sonographers specialize in imaging a patient's abdominal cavity and nearby organs, such as the kidney, liver, gallbladder, pancreas, or spleen. Abdominal sonographers may assist with biopsies or other examinations requiring ultrasound guidance.
- Breast sonographers specialize in imaging a patient's breast tissues. Sonography can confirm the presence of cysts and tumors that may have been detected by the
 patient, the physician, or a mammogram. Breast sonographers work closely with physicians and assist with procedures that track tumors and help to provide
 information that will aid doctors in making decisions about the best treatment options for breast cancer patients.
- Cardiac sonographers (echocardiographers) specialize in imaging a patient's heart. They use ultrasound equipment to examine the heart's chambers, valves, and vessels. The images obtained are known as echocardiograms. An echocardiogram may be performed either while the patient is resting or after the patient has been physically active. Cardiac sonographers also may take echocardiograms of fetal hearts so that physicians can diagnose cardiac conditions during pregnancy. Cardiac sonographers work closely with physicians or surgeons before, during, and after procedures.
- Musculoskeletal sonographers specialize in imaging muscles, ligaments, tendons, and joints. These sonographers may assist with ultrasound guidance for injections, or during surgical procedures, that deliver medication or treatment directly to affected tissues.
- *Pediatric sonographers* specialize in imaging children and infants. Many of the medical conditions they image are associated with premature births or birth defects. Pediatric sonographers may work closely with pediatricians and other caregivers.
- Obstetric and gynecologic sonographers specialize in imaging the female reproductive system. Many pregnant women receive sonograms to track the baby's growth and health. Obstetrical sonographers work closely with physicians in detecting congenital birth defects.
- Vascular technologists (vascular sonographers) create images of blood vessels and collect data that help physicians diagnose disorders affecting blood flow. Vascular technologists often measure a patient's blood pressure and the volume of blood in their arms, legs, fingers, and toes in order to evaluate blood flow and identify blocked arteries or blood clots in the body.

Cardiovascular technologists and technicians create images and conduct tests involving the heart and lungs. The following are examples of types of cardiovascular technologists and technicians:

- Cardiovascular invasive specialists, also known as cardiac catheterization technologists or cardiovascular technologists, monitor patients' heart rates and help physicians in diagnosing and treating problems with patients' hearts. They assist with cardiac catheterization, which involves threading a catheter through a patient's artery to the heart. They also prepare and monitor patients during open-heart surgery and during the insertion of pacemakers and stents. Technologists prepare patients for procedures by shaving and cleansing the area into which the catheter will be inserted and by administering topical anesthesia. During the procedure, they monitor the patient's blood pressure and heart rate.
- Cardiographic or electrocardiogram (EKG) technicians specialize in EKG testing. EKG machines monitor the heart's performance through electrodes attached to a patient's chest, arms, and legs. The tests can be done while the patient is at rest or while the patient is physically active. For a stress test, the patient walks on a treadmill and the technician gradually increases the speed to observe the effect on the heart of increased exertion.
- Pulmonary function technologists, also known as cardiopulmonary technologists, monitor and test patients' lungs and breathing. For example, they use spirometry to measure the amount of air that a patient can inhale or exhale. These technologists help physicians in diagnosing and treating problems of the pulmonary system.

Diagnostic medical sonographers and cardiovascular technologists and technicians, including vascular technologists, complete most of their work at diagnostic imaging machines in dimly lit rooms. They may perform procedures at patients' bedsides. Diagnostic imaging workers may be on their feet for long periods and may need to lift or turn patients who are ill or disabled.

Work Schedules

Most diagnostic imaging workers work full time. Some may work evenings, weekends, or overnight because they work in facilities that are always open.

How to Become a Diagnostic Medical Sonographer or Cardiovascular Technologist or Technician, Including Vascular **Technologist**

Diagnostic medical sonographers and cardiovascular technologists and technicians, including vascular technologists, need formal education, such as an associate's degree or a postsecondary certificate. Many employers also require professional certification.

Education

Colleges and universities offer both associate's and bachelor's degree programs in sonography and in cardiovascular and vascular technology. One-year certificate programs also are available from colleges and some hospitals.

Employers typically prefer graduates of programs accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP)

Sonography, cardiovascular, and vascular education programs usually include courses in anatomy, medical terminology, and applied sciences. Most sonography programs are divided into the specialized fields listed earlier that correspond to the relevant certification exams, such as abdominal sonography or breast sonography. Cardiovascular and vascular programs include coursework in either invasive or

noninvasive cardiovascular or vascular technology procedures. In addition to requiring classroom study, most programs include a clinical component in which students earn credit while working under a more experienced technologist in a hospital, a physician's office, or an imaging laboratory.

High school students who are interested in diagnostic medical sonography, cardiovascular technology, or vascular technology should take courses in anatomy, physiology, physics, and math.

Licenses, Certifications, and Registrations

Most employers prefer to hire diagnostic imaging workers with professional certification, or they may expect applicants to earn certification shortly after being hired. Many insurance providers and Medicare pay for procedures only if a certified sonographer, technologist, or technician performed the work. Certification is available from the American Registry for Diagnostic Medical Sonographers , Cardiovascular Credentialing International , and American Registry of Radiologic Technologists .

Diagnostic imaging workers can earn certification by graduating from an accredited program, although candidates also may qualify through alternative combinations of education and experience. All candidates must pass an exam. Most of the certifications are for specialties in diagnostic imaging; for example, a sonographer can earn a certification in abdominal sonography. Most diagnostic imaging workers have at least one certification, but many earn multiple certifications.

In addition, many employers prefer to hire candidates who have a basic life support (BLS) certification, which affirms that they are trained to provide CPR.

Few states require diagnostic medical sonographers to be licensed. Typically, professional certification is required for licensure; other requirements vary by state. Contact state medical boards for more information.

Important Qualities

Detail oriented. Diagnostic imaging workers must follow precise instructions to obtain the images needed to diagnose and treat patients. They must also pay attention to the screen while scanning a patient's body, because the cues that contrast healthy areas with unhealthy ones may be subtle.

Hand-eye coordination. To get quality images, diagnostic imaging workers must accurately move equipment on the patient's body in response to what they see on the screen.

Interpersonal skills. Diagnostic imaging workers must work closely with patients. Sometimes patients are in extreme pain or mental stress, and these workers must get cooperation from the patients in order to create usable images. Diagnostic imaging workers must also communicate clearly when discussing images with physicians and other members of the healthcare team.

Physical stamina. Diagnostic imaging workers are on their feet for long periods and must be able to lift and move patients who need assistance.

Technical skills. Diagnostic imaging workers must understand how to operate complex machinery and computerized instruments.



Employment of diagnostic medical sonographers is projected to grow 17 percent from 2019 to 2029, much faster than the average for all occupations. Employment of cardiovascular technologists and technicians, including vascular technologists, is projected to grow 5 percent from 2019 to 2029, faster than the average for all occupations.


As the large baby-boom population ages, the need to diagnose medical conditions such as blood clots and heart disease—will likely increase. Imaging technology is a tool used in making these diagnoses. Moreover, diagnostic medical sonographers, cardiovascular technologists and technicians, and vascular technologists will continue to be needed in healthcare settings to provide an alternative to imaging techniques that involve radiation.

Job Prospects

Diagnostic imaging personnel who are certified are expected to have the best job opportunities. Those certified in more than one specialty are expected to find even greater job opportunities.



Mary shared the curriculum, found in WIDS, from the Northeast program with the Board. She asked the group the need for a sonography program and the board's response was overwhelming on the need for this program. Dr. Broghammer, Rob Weisbecker , and Sandy D. voiced their frustration and concern on the dire shortage of qualified sonographers in our area. Departments are extremely short staffed and sonographers are required to work 24 and 48 hours shifts in some departments. Sue Reiter asked if there was any concern with the competition of Froedtert, UWM and Concordia; would there be too many programs? Dr. Broghammer said that the goal is not to meet the demand but exceed the demand due to the high turnover and the expansion of medical imaging facilities. The board voiced that there needs to be mindfulness of program size to allow the students appropriate clinical experiences working with the shortage of sonography techs.

A motion was proposed by Dr. Broghammer and seconded by Sandy to bring this new sonography program forward quickly. All were in favor.

After the motion carried, it was asked of Mary what the timeline would be for the start of this program. Mary responded that the Healthcare pathway would have to present this to the MATC advisory board. From what she understands, this could be a 5 month long process. Tentative program rollout could be Fall 2021 or Spring 2022.

Background Information:

The Healthcare Pathway Leadership was approached by a representative from the yoga community in the summer of 2020 about the possibility of MATC developing an enhanced yoga instructor program as a diploma. The yoga community wants to move yoga instruction from a job to a profession. This group would like to have yoga instructors certified and/or licensed at the national and/or state level. Data shows that several injuries occur during the practice of yoga. One way to help decrease the number of injuries is to better prepare yoga instructors in injury prevention and adaptive techniques based on an individual's medical condition.

The Enhanced Yoga Instructor Technical Diploma will include the current Yoga Alliance curriculum and be enhanced by adding course content in anatomy, kinesiology, medical terminology, injury prevention, nutrition and entrepreneurship/business. This diploma will also be able to matriculate to several other programs such as the new Integrative Health AAS, Physical and Occupational Therapist associate degrees as well as aligning well with other diploma programs. The Enhanced Yoga Instructor will be of interest to dual enrollment high school students as well as post-professionals who are looking for professional development and personal enrichment opportunities. We are also in discussion with 4-year partners to explore a variety of possibilities for their graduates and how this program will enhance their 4-year degree.

For those graduating with their Enhanced Yoga Instructor technical diploma and seeking employment, the average yoga instructor in the Milwaukee area earns \$36.00 per hour and there is a projected 8% increase in job growth. We believe this enhanced credential will allow our graduates to stand out among other applicants.

Program and Credential:

The practice of yoga continues to grow at a rate that is greater than average. Yoga is not only used for personal health and wellness but has become integrated into healthcare as a common treatment modality by healthcare professionals. In addition to the basic Yoga Instructor curriculum through the Yoga Alliance, the Enhanced Yoga Instructor diploma program will include additional course content related to anatomy, kinesiology, medical terminology, entrepreneurship/business, nutrition and injury prevention. The Yoga Alliance is the largest nonprofit association representing the yoga community. The Yoga Alliance fosters and supports the high quality, safe, accessible, and equitable teaching of yoga. Graduates from the program will be able to use the Yoga Alliance credentials, RYT which stands for Registered Yoga Teacher. The Enhanced Yoga Instructor diploma program will be part of the wellness promotion initiative in the Healthcare Pathway on the Mequon campus. As a Technical College, our mission is to provide credentials that meet the needs of employers and customers that provide our communities with a skilled workforce.

Student Population:

The Enhanced Yoga Instructor diploma program will be of interest to prospective students wanting to teach yoga classes to the general public and/or professionals who want to understand the practice of yoga in order to incorporate the concepts into their related professional services. Persons wanting more information about yoga practice for their own health and wellness will also be attracted to this program. This diploma program will not only provide students with a matriculation opportunity to many of MATC's AAS degrees in health, but will also serve as a specialty focus for graduates from two and four year healthcare programs who want to add the art of yoga to their skill set and enhance their practice for increased holistic client care delivery.



Current and Projected Need:

Considering the current coronavirus pandemic healthcare landscape and its impact on emotional, mental and physical well-being, an individual's need and desire to focus on their own health and wellness has increased. Healthcare is also evolving and expanding ways to deliver quality patient care that includes prevention and wellness. According to current data there will be an average to above average demand for yoga instructor training over the next 5-10 years. This current data does not include how COVID-19 will impact the demand. However, the anecdotal data suggest yoga practice and skills will be in high demand soon.

Partnerships/Advisory Group:

In October of 2020, the Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) Advisory Board met about the need for a yoga instructor diploma program. The members were in unanimous support of a program that focuses on yoga instruction and practice. An advisory board specific to the proposed yoga instructor diploma program will be established when the program is formerly approved.


Articulation:

Thank you for your email. To answer your questions:

1. There are two organizations that offer yoga teacher training with the most popular being Yoga Alliance. I have attached their curriculum. Our leadership was approached this semester by personnel from both Lifetime Fitness in Brookfield and Regional Directors from Ascension. During these discussions the idea of integrative health came up with a need for yoga instructors, spiritual coaches, wellness coaches etc. Specific to yoga instructors, the concern is that research shows a significant number of injuries occur from yoga practice.

2. The yogi and general community believe it is due to the lack of sufficient course content in anatomy and kinesiology. Many feel the best yoga instructors are those who also have some level of education in healthcare ie; nurse, PT or PTA, OT or OTA. There is a movement within the yoga community to move the yoga instructor to a level of increased accountability by enhancing the current curriculum and moving toward national and or state certification or licensure. Currently, yoga instructor training is offered over a three day weekend (200) hours at several locations in the area. It's 200hrs typically done either intensively in a few months or weekend format spread over 9 months to a year. Yoga Alliance is the accreditation. There are hours required by YA for anatomy, however we will require more.

3. The program we are wanting to develop will be called Enhanced Yoga Instructor diploma. The diploma will include the Yoga Alliance curriculum but then be enhanced by adding additional anatomy and kinesiology content along with abbreviated medical terminology, injury prevention, and entrepreneurship/business. Many yoga instructors want to hang their own single and run their own studio so having a business class that focuses on entrepreneurship will be helpful. I am not sure if nutrition is being considered but it certainly makes sense. We are anticipating 18-25 credit hours.







Location Quotient

Location quotient (LQ) is a way of quantifying how concentrated a particular industry, cluster, occupation, or demographic group is in a region as compared to the nation. It can reveal what makes a particular region unique in comparison to the national average.

Occupation Data

Emsi occupation employment data are based on final Emsi industry data and final Emsi staffing patterns. Wage estimates are based on Occupational Employment Statistics (QCEW and Non-QCEW Employees classes of worker) and the American Community Survey (Self-Employed and Extended Proprietors). Occupational wage estimates also affected by county-level Emsi earnings by industry.

Staffing Patterns Data

The staffing pattern data in this report are compiled from several sources using a specialized process. For QCEW and Non-QCEW Employees classes of worker, sources include Occupational Employment Statistics, the National Industry-Occupation Employment Matrix, and the American Community Survey. Fitness trainers and instructors lead, instruct, and motivate individuals or groups in exercise activities, including cardiovascular exercises (exercises for the heart and blood circulation), strength training, and stretching. They work with people of all ages and skill levels.

Duties

Fitness trainers and instructors typically do the following:

- Demonstrate or explain how to perform various exercises and routines to minimize injuries and improve fitness
- Watch clients do exercises to ensure that they are using the correct techniques
- Provide alternative exercises during workouts or classes for different levels of fitness and skill
- Monitor clients' progress and adapt programs as needed
- Explain and enforce safety rules and regulations on sports, recreational activities, and the use of exercise equipment
- Give clients information or resources about nutrition, weight control, and lifestyle issues
- Give emergency first aid if needed



Fitness trainers and instructors work with people of all ages and skill levels.

Both group fitness instructors and specialized fitness instructors plan or choreograph their own classes. Classes may include cardiovascular exercises, such as aerobics or dance; strength training, such as lifting weights; or both. Instructors choose music that is appropriate for their exercise class and create a routine or a set of moves for participants to follow. Some may teach prechoreographed routines that were originally created by fitness companies or other organizations.

Personal fitness trainers design and carry out workout routines specific to the needs of their clients. They may work with individual clients or teach group classes. In larger facilities, personal trainers often sell their training sessions to gym members. They start by evaluating their clients' current fitness level, personal goals, and skills. Then, they develop personalized training programs for their clients to follow, and they monitor the clients' progress.

Fitness trainers and instructors in smaller facilities often do a variety of tasks in addition to their fitness duties, such as tending the front desk, signing up new members, giving tours of the facility, or supervising the weight-training and cardiovascular equipment areas. Fitness trainers and instructors also may promote their facilities and instruction by various means, such as through social media, by writing newsletters or blog articles, or by creating posters and flyers.

Gyms and other types of health clubs offer many different activities for clients. However, trainers and instructors frequently specialize in only a few areas. The following are examples of types of fitness trainers and instructors:

Personal fitness trainers work with an individual client or a small group. They may train in a gym or in clients' homes. Personal fitness trainers assess the client's level of physical fitness and help them set and reach their fitness goals.

Group fitness instructors organize and lead group exercise classes, which can include aerobic exercises, stretching, or muscle conditioning. Some classes are set to music. In these classes, instructors may select the music and choreograph an exercise sequence. They may lead classes that use specific exercise equipment, such as stationary bicycles.

Specialized fitness instructors teach popular conditioning methods, such as Pilates or yoga. In these classes, instructors show the different moves and positions of the particular method. They also watch students and correct those who are doing the exercises improperly.

Fitness directors oversee the fitness-related aspects of a gym or other type of health club. They often handle administrative duties, such as scheduling personal training sessions for clients and creating workout incentive programs. They may select and order fitness equipment for their facility.


Almost all trainers and instructors have at least a high school diploma before entering the occupation. An increasing number of employers are requiring fitness workers, particularly personal trainers, to have an associate's or bachelor's degree related to a health or fitness field, such as exercise science, kinesiology, or physical education. Programs often include courses in nutrition, exercise techniques, biology, anatomy, and group fitness. Personal trainers also learn how to develop fitness programs for clients of all ages.

Licenses, Certifications, and Registrations

Employers prefer to hire fitness trainers and instructors who are certified. Many personal trainers must be certified before they begin working with clients or with members of a gym or other type of health club. Group fitness instructors can begin work without certification, but employers often encourage or require them to become certified. Most specialized fitness instructors receive certification for their preferred type of training, such as yoga or Pilates.

Many organizations offer certification. The National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA), part of the Institute for Credentialing Excellence , lists certifying organizations that are accredited.

All certification exams have a written part, and some also have a practical part. The exams measure the candidate's knowledge of human physiology, understanding of proper exercise techniques, and ability to assess clients' fitness levels and develop appropriate exercise programs. Many certifying organizations offer study materials to prepare for the exam, including books, webinars, other audio and visual materials, and exam preparation workshops and seminars.



Personal trainers may work with individual clients or teach group classes.

Most trainers or instructors need certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and automated external defibrillators (AED) before applying for certification in physical fitness.

After becoming a certified personal trainer, new trainers typically work alongside an experienced trainer before they are allowed to train clients alone.

Training for specialized fitness instructors can vary greatly. For example, the duration of programs for yoga instructors can range from a few days to more than 2 years. The <u>Yoga Alliance</u> offers several credentials that require a minimum of between 200 and 500 hours, with a specified number of hours in techniques, teaching methods, anatomy, physiology, philosophy, and other areas.

Important Qualities

Customer-service skills. Many fitness trainers and instructors must sell their services, motivating clients to hire them as personal trainers or to sign up for the classes they lead. Fitness trainers and instructors must therefore be polite, friendly, and encouraging, to maintain relationships with their clients.

Communication skills. Fitness trainers and instructors must clearly explain or demonstrate exercises to clients.

Listening skills. Fitness trainers and instructors must listen carefully to what clients tell them in order to determine the clients' fitness levels and desired fitness goals.

Motivational skills. Getting fit and staying fit takes a lot of work for many clients. To keep clients coming back for more classes or to continue personal training, fitness trainers and instructors must keep their clients motivated.

Physical fitness. Fitness trainers and instructors need to be physically fit because their job requires a considerable amount of exercise. Group instructors often participate in classes, and personal trainers often need to demonstrate exercises to their clients.

Problem-solving skills. Fitness trainers and instructors must evaluate each client's level of fitness and create an appropriate fitness plan to meet the client's individual needs.

Advancement

Fitness trainers and instructors who are interested in management positions should get a bachelor's degree in exercise science, physical education, kinesiology, or a related subject. Experience often is required in order for a trainer or instructor to advance to a management position in a health club or fitness center. Some organizations prefer a master's degree for certain positions.

Personal trainers may eventually advance to a head trainer position and become responsible for hiring and overseeing the personal training staff or for bringing in new personal training clients. Head trainers also are responsible for procuring athletic equipment, such as weights or fitness machines. Some fitness trainers and instructors go into business for themselves and open their own fitness centers.



The median annual wage for fitness trainers and instructors was \$40,390 in May 2019. The median wage is the wage at which half the workers in an occupation earned more than that amount and half earned less. The lowest 10 percent earned less than \$21,110, and the highest 10 percent earned more than \$75,400.

In May 2019, the median annual wages for fitness trainers and instructors in the top industries in which they worked were as follows:

Fitness trainers and instructors may work nights, weekends, or holidays. Some travel to different gyms or to clients' homes to teach classes or conduct personal training sessions. Some group fitness instructors and personal fitness trainers work other full-time jobs and teach fitness classes or conduct personal training sessions part time during evenings or weekends.



Employment of fitness trainers and instructors is projected to grow 15 percent from 2019 to 2029, much faster than the average for all occupations.

As businesses, government, and insurance organizations continue to recognize the benefits of health and fitness programs for their employees, incentives to join gyms or other types of health clubs are expected to increase the need for fitness trainers and instructors. For example, some organizations may open their own exercise facilities onsite to promote employee wellness.

Other employment growth will come from the continuing emphasis on exercise to combat obesity and encourage healthier lifestyles for people of all ages. In particular, the baby-boom generation should continue to remain active to help prevent injuries and illnesses associated with aging.





Q2 Which Yoga Instructor are you most likely to hire based on the level of training described below?



- Provide visual and verbal instruction on proper body mechanics and include modifications that would allow a workout for all fitness levels.
- Monitor the intensity of the workout by taking heart rate checks, rating of perceived exertion and observing individuals in class.
- Watch for new participants who gravitate to the back of the class and create connections.

Member Experience

- Always interact with members in a friendly, courteous manner. Be available for members before and after each class. Learn and use the members' names each time you teach.
- Welcome back existing participants by name; be mindful of new members and make them feel comfortable.
- · Coach and Compliment. Give positive feedback and encouragement. Focus on their workout, not your workout.
- Smile. Face class members whenever possible; eye contact is essential.
- Responsible for finding coverage when you are sick or on vacation. Strive to have a maximum of one substitute per class every two months to ensure member and class consistency.
- Do the little things to help create a positive experience for our members, such as straightening out the locker room, lending a hand at the front desk, answering member questions and promoting upcoming events.

- Check in with the Front Desk to build Team Member relationships.



Students receiving <u>Title IV Federal F</u>financial <u>A</u>aid must make Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) towards the completion of course requirements for an associate degree, technical diploma or eligible certificate. Students can only receive financial aid for classes that are required or prepare them for success (remedial courses) in their <u>academic program</u>. <u>area</u>. All periods of enrollment and applicable credits are included even if the student did not receive financial aid for them. To be considered in good standing at Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC), a student must meet all of the following requirements:

Grade Point Average (GPA) Requirement:

• A student must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better. Remedial credits will be considered in GPA. For repeat coursework, the highest grade received will be considered.

Completion Rate Percentage Requirement:

• A student must successfully complete 67% of all <u>cumulative</u> credits attempted. This is a <u>cumulative percentage</u>. Credits attempted is defined as the total credits you are enrolled in (including remedial, repeated courses, withdrawals, incompletes and transfer credits) even if you did not receive aid for them.

Maximum Time Frame Requirement:

Students must complete an associate degree, technical diploma or eligible certificate before 150% of credits required for program completion graduation are attempted. (Example: If an associate degree (2₋-year published length) requires 60 credits, a student must complete the degree before 90 credits have been attempted.) Students may be deemed ineligible for aid at the point when they cannot mathematically complete their program within the 150% maximum time-frame.

Remedial Courses

A student admitted to an<u>Title IV-</u>eligible program may take up to one academic year's (not to exceed 30 credits) worth of remedial non-program credits (not to exceed 30 credits) to be included in the <u>SAP</u> evaluation.-of a student's SAP.

A student enrolled solely in a remedial program is not considered to be enrolled in a financial aid eligible program and, therefore, is not eligible for financial aid. If acceptance into a financial aid eligible program is contingent on completing remedial work, a student cannot be considered enrolled in that program until the student completes the remedial work.

English as a Second Language (ESL)

A student admitted to a Title IV eligible program may take up to one academic year's work of English as a second language non-program credits (not to exceed 30 credits) to be included in the evaluation of a student's SAP. Similar to other remedial coursework, a student may receive federal student aid for ESL courses that are part of an eligible program. As discussed above for remedial courses, the new SAP regulations do not require an institution to count remedial courses in determining completion rate.

Repeated Coursework

Once a student has received a passing grade in a course, they can only receive financial aid for one additional attempt at attaining a better grade. All repeats will be included in credits attempted, but only the highest grade is included in GPA. All passing grades are included in completed credits. A grade does not have to meet requirements for the program to be considered passing for repeat coursework. All courses will remain on the student's transcript.

Evaluation

Financial aid and non-financial aid recipient's <u>SAP satisfactory progress</u> is evaluated after the completion of each semester or payment period, including the summer semester.

Financial Aid Warning

If the student does not meet the above standards, they are placed on Academic/Financial Aid Warning for one semester. This period allows the student an opportunity to return to good standing, while still maintaining their financial aid <u>eligibility</u>. During this warning semester, the student must meet the standards at the end of the term or they will be placed on <u>ineligible</u> financial aid <u>status</u>. <u>suspension</u>. Also during the period, the student is on Financial Aid Warning status, they may be requested to complete an advisor approved academic plan and participate in any recommended <u>support service activities</u>.

Ineligible Financial Aid Suspension

If the student does not meet the minimum <u>SAP</u>standards, they are the student will be given an ineligible Financial Aid status at the end of the payment period. A student who has an ineligible <u>Financial Aid status may submit a Financial Aid Appeal Form for a re-evaluation of their financial aid</u>

eligibility. placed on Academic/Financial Aid Suspension. Students who are suspended may submitan "Appeal."

Appeal Process

Appeals-Financial aid appeals cannot be based on a need for aid or lack of knowledge of the warning status. An appeal must be based on mitigating circumstances or conditions which prevented the student from being successful (i.e. illness, injury, etc.). Documentation is required. EXCEPTION: Circumstances related to the COVIID-19 pandemic. A student, may be required. Students who believes their circumstances merit reconsideration, may appeal their ineligible Financial Aid status suspension by submitting an Academic/Financial Aid Appeal Form (available online on the Financial Aid Office Department web page). Documentation may be required. Students who believe their circumstances merit reconsideration may appeal their suspension by submitting an Academic/Financial Aid Appeal Form (available online on the Financial Aid Office web page). The appeal requires the students to explain why they failed to meet the standards and what has changed that will allow them to meet these standards during the time needed for program completionnext term. Appeals are reviewed by the Financial Aid Advisory Committee (FAAC) the Financial Aid leadership team or their designee. on a regular basis. Students are notified by their MATC email of the appeal decision, and the conditions required regardless of the success of theirappeal the appeal decision. A student, along with their advisor must develop and academic plan that ensures the student is able to meet MATC's SAP standards by a specific time. The student will also need to participate, in a minimum of at least one (1) support service intervention, offered through the college.

Financial Aid Probation

First time suspended students whose appeal is approved are placed on "Probation with Financial-Aid." They may receive financial aid for one payment period. If a student's appeal is approved, their status will be "eligible for financial aid probation." The students may receive financial aid for one payment period. The College may require them to fulfill specific terms and conditions such as taking a reduced course loads or enrolling in specific course(s). At the end of one the "eligible financial aid probation period, the student's status must be "eligible for financial aid" by satisfying requirement of a 2.0 term GPA and 100% term completion rate.probationary period, the student must in goodstanding and meet the conditions of the SAP appeal to be eligible for further aid. The student musthave a 2.0 term GPA.

Students that are on probation <u>"eligible financial aid" probation who are and are</u> unable to meet SAP standards at the end of the term, but meet the conditions of their appeal, will be required to reappeal <u>if the term GPA and term completion rate meet the conditions of the probation</u>. and <u>The</u> <u>student will be required to meet</u> work with an academic advisor to update their program <u>academic</u> plan. This plan must ensure the student will return to <u>good</u> SAP <u>eligible financial aid status within a</u> specific time frame. standing within a specific time frame. Students that granted an Academic/Financial Aid Appeal for one or more suspensions, are placed on "Monitored Academic-Plan with Financial Aid."

Students who appealed but have not met SAP and the conditions of their appeal; who had their appeal denied; or who chose not to appeal may continue self-pay to continue enrollment until their financial aid status returns to "eligible". they return to good SAP standing or receive a successful appeal decision. It is the student's responsibility to meet the Cumulative and GPA established eligibility.

Treatment of Grades

Attempted-Not Earned Credits: Incomplete (I), <u>Withdrawal Withdrawn</u> (W), <u>No Pass (NP)</u>, Unsatisfactory (U) are counted as credits attempted but not successfully completed.

Attempted-Earned Credits: Letter grades of A, B, C, and D count as completed credits. <u>and Low</u> <u>Pass (LP) are counted as attempted and completed credits.</u>

Grade Point Average: Grade Point Average (GPA) is calculated using a grade point value for grades A, B, C, D, U, and W. and U. Grades of Incomplete (I) are excluded from the GPA calculation.

Incomplete Grade: A grade of Incomplete "I" may be assigned if the instructor and student both sign an Incomplete Agreement. A grade of "I" is a temporary grade and will automatically become a "U" at the end of the next semester, if required course work is not completed. The GPA and completion rate will be recalculated after the grade of "I" is incomplete grade(s) are converted to a letter grade at the end of the current semester. The student's financial aid eligibility status will not be recalculated, retroactive.

Grade Changes: Grades that are changed through the grade appeal process or correction of a grade by an instructor, will result in the recalculation of the cumulative GPA and completion rate.

Withdrawals

A grade of "Drop" is assigned when a student withdraws from a course before the financial aid census date. Grades of "Drop" are not included in the GPA calculation, completion rate, or maximum time frame calculations. <u>Withdrawal_A "W" grade</u> is assigned when an instructor withdraws the student from a class after the class has started and when the student withdraws from the course after the financial aid census date. <u>MATC bases withdrawal calculations on credit hours</u>, driven by credits attempted. These grades are <u>A "W" is</u> considered attempted but not successfully completed credits. A grade of Withdrawal <u>"W"</u> impacts the completion rate, GPA and the maximum time frame calculations. An associate degree published program length is two years. Diploma program published lengths range from six months to two years.

Transfer credits

Transfer credits are credits that were earned at another college and are accepted by MATC. These credits count toward the student's maximum time frame and completion rate, but are excluded from the GPA calculation.

Program Changes

Students who are in compliance with-<u>SAP_MATC's Satisfactory Academic Progress policy</u>, may remain eligible for financial aid if they change their program of student or complete one degree and pursue another degree. <u>Students who change their program of study will need to submit a financial aid appeal to be reinstated to "eligible" financial aid and must be able to complete their program within the 150% maximum timeframe.</u>

Change in Program/Additional Program of Study: <u>Graduating from one program or switching to</u> <u>a second program does not restart the count of attempted credits.</u> The maximum time frame for financial aid will include all credits for both <u>the former past</u> and current program. Graduating from one program or switching to a second program does not restart the count of attempted credits.</u> For those enrolled in multiple programs, the time frame for the longest program determines the maximum number of credits. <u>If the Financial Aid Office becomes aware that a student has changed</u> their program of study and the student does not have the capacity to complete the new program within the 150% maximum timeframe, their financial aid status will be changed to "Ineligible": Attachment 8-b


