#### **CALL TO ORDER**

#### Discussion Chairperson Foley:

- Notified the Board that meetings with MATC District Legislators are taking place virtually in January and February and calendar invites will be sent to them. Stated the importance of the Board to accept the invites as attendance may be tracked. Stated meetings with Representatives Dora Drake and Deb Andraca and Senator Chris Larson took place the week prior to the Board meeting.
- Announced the Association of Community College Trustees
   (ACCT) National Legislative Summit will be held virtually on
   February 8 10, 2021 and stated there are meetings scheduled
   with Senators Ron Johnson and Tammy Baldwin.

- Discussed ideas on topics for a virtual spring board retreat.
  Proposed the following topics:
  - o Scenario planning for a post-COVID future
  - o Trends in higher education
  - o Facilities planning for the future
  - Moonshot for Equity
  - o Achieving the Dream
  - o Guided Pathways

#### 7 b. President's Report

#### Discussion Dr. Martin:

- Reported she was invited to present to the Achieving The Dream 2020 President's Cohort on the topic of student success in a crisis in which she had an opportunity to highlight the college's response to the pandemic through the use of scenario planning and the establishment of an Integration Team. She thanked Dr. Christine Manion and Ms. Janice Falkenberg for their efforts on these initiatives.
- Stated Dr. Naydeen Gonzalez-De Jesus attended the January 15, 2021 Department of Correction virtual graduation ceremony in her behalf. This ceremony included Governor Evers and seven students who graduated from the college's Second Chance Pell Program achieving grade point averages higher than 3.0 for two straight years. Dr. Martin thanked Dr. Sadique Isahaku and his team for their efforts in this initiative.
- Announced the college held its Faculty Coordination Day also on January 15 and welcomed college faculty to the spring semester.
- Reported the college has expanded its onsite COVID-19 testing to all employees and students at the college's Oak Creek and Downtown Campuses, and the college is working with local health officials to facilitate access to the COVID-19 vaccine.

#### 7 c. District Student Senate Report

Mr. Phong Nguyen, Student Government at the West Allis Campus, gave the report on behalf of Ms. Brandi Martin, who was not able to attend the meeting.

#### Discussion Mr. Phong Nguyen:

- Announced the District Student Government is looking to expand their work, such as the creation of a Graduation Speaker Taskforce to develop ways to have the students' voice in the selection of a graduation speaker.
- Stated he is working on events related to inclusion of students from different walks of life.

 Thanked the MATC faculty and staff for all the work done during the pandemic, stating he felt MATC done a good job in comparison with other colleges.

#### 7 d. Milwaukee PBS VP General Manager's Report

#### Discussion

Mr. Bohdan Zachary:

- Reported the station raised a record one million dollars in December, making the station confident the \$5.2 million goal in FY21 may be achieved. The next fundraising drive starts in March.
- Welcomed to Milwaukee PBS, MATC and the city of Milwaukee, Mariano Avila, who joined the station as a bilingual multimedia producer and reporter. Mr. Avila was recently inclusion reporter at WGVU, the PBS television station and NPR radio station in Grand Rapids, MI.
- Announced, starting Wednesday, January 27, Milwaukee PBS is producing a special edition of Black Nouveau, "Understanding Implicit Bias", which will be hosted by Earl Arms. The interactive workshop will be moderated by Kima Hamilton and Dasha Kelly Hamilton, and stated 500 RSVPs were tracked for the virtual event.
- Introduced Mr. Everett Marshburn, Coordinator TV Production, who gave more details and shared a promotional spot on "Understanding Implicit Bias".
- Reported Milwaukee PBS will air a live hour-long special on the rollout of the COVID vaccine titled "The Vaccine: A Milwaukee PBS Special". This will combine the talents and resources of news and public affairs series Black Nouveau, Adelante! and 10thirtysix.
- Asked Maryann Lazarski, producer of 10thirtysix, Patricia Gomez, host and producer of Adelante! and Everett Marshburn, producer of Black Nouveau to provide overviews and details on the importance of this special.
- Announced Milwaukee PBS was honored for Excellence in Content at the 52<sup>nd</sup> Annual Public Media Awards and thanked the entire staff at Milwaukee PBS for working tirelessly to provide much needed programming that reflects the critical issues of our times and community.

#### 7 e. Legislative Matters Report

#### Discussion

Ms. Falkenberg introduced Ms. Ramie Zelenkova, lobbyist, Hubbard Wilson & Zelenkova, who presented the Legislative Matters Report on recent legislative matters impacting higher education, such as:

- The Senate will be evenly split among Democrats and Republicans, during the 117<sup>th</sup> Congress, with each party holding 50 seats. Vice President Harris will serve as the tie-breaking vote, giving Democrats the Senate majority.
- The Department of Education announces availability of Higher Education Emergency Relief (HEER) Funds. A total of \$21.2 billion in HEER funding for colleges and students was authorized by Congress and signed into law on December 27, 2020.
- President Biden unveiled a \$1.9 Trillion COVID-relief proposal.
  The proposal includes relief for higher education, childcare, and state and local aid.
- Assembly Bill 1 relating to a state COVID-19 response was introduced earlier this month. Action on the bill is pending at the time of this report.
- Governor Evers will give his Budget Address on February 16<sup>th</sup>.
  The Governor will unveil his budget recommendation for the 2021-2023 Biennial Budget at this time.
